JOURNAL ENTRY #1: PRE-READING

During the coming year in World Cultures, we will work to understand various cultures by learning about the daily lives of people in different parts of the world. In doing so, we will be able to look beyond our preconceived stereotypes about those areas and their people.

Create a Google Doc for your two journal entries. Before you read, reflect on your own knowledge about life in conflict zones and/or natural disaster zones. **Journal Entry #1: What do you think daily life is like for a typical person who lives in one of those zones, and where did you get that impression?** Be specific. When writing about daily life, think about jobs, education, food, leisure time, clothing, etc. When describing your sources of information, include the names of those sources. (For example, do not include "the news" unless you actually read a specific newspaper or watch a specific news show.)

The entry should have an MLA header and be at least a half page (Times New Roman, 12-pt. font, double-spaced, in paragraph form).
