The Haverford School, a nonsectarian college preparatory school for pre-k through grade 12, provides a superior liberal arts education for qualified boys of differing backgrounds. We are committed to developing the full intellectual, artistic, athletic, and moral potential in each boy, and we aim to graduate young men with strong character who possess a passion for learning and the necessary problem-solving skills to make a difference in the world. The Haverford School prepares boys for life.

Accreditation

Haverford is accredited by the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Schools (PAIS) and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSACS), and is a member of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) and International Boys' Schools Coalition (IBSC).

Location

Haverford is situated on 30 acres in Haverford and Lower Merion townships, adjacent to Haverford College; accessible by public transportation, SEPTA regional rail (Paoli/Thorndale), bus (#105) and trolley (#100), as well as buses from 20 districts.

Campus & Facilities

Haverford features eight buildings with 70 classrooms, two libraries, 10 science labs, a design and engineering studio, two auditoriums/theaters, 10 art studios, nine music studios, three indoor and two outdoor basketball courts, four athletic fields (three artificial turf, one grass), four tennis courts, a pool, an outdoor rubberized track, four squash courts, a fitness and weight training center, a wrestling room, and a climbing wall.

Technology

Our network infrastructure provides high-performance connectivity throughout campus buildings and support for a 1:1 deployment of wireless devices, mobile devices, Apple TVs, email and file sharing, and video streaming. The Canvas learning management system in grades 5-12 connects instructors and students in and out of the classroom and provides a single space for sharing documents, submitting assignments, and assigning grades, as well as personalized features that enhance the learning experience for individual students. All classrooms include interactive whiteboards/projectors and full access to high-speed, wireless Internet. We support 1,100+ school-owned computers in a multi-platform environment, a bring-your-own device-program in the Upper School, 1:1 Chromebook/laptop carts in Middle and Lower Schools, and approximately 200 iPads.

Athletics

Haverford is a proud member of the Inter-Academic League and fields 16 interscholastic sports. In 2017-18, the basketball, swimming, and tennis teams were Inter-Ac League Champions. Squash earned a No. 2 national ranking and was MASA Champion, the swim team was Eastern Interscholastic Swimming Champion, and basketball was a PAISSA tournament finalist. In 2017, the Fords won the Heyward Cup for the 17th time, demonstrating overall excellence in athletic competition.

Arts & Music

Haverford's visual arts program includes 10 art spaces and a design and engineering studio in which students practice drawing, painting, photography, website design, video and animation, ceramics, and woodworking. Our acclaimed theater program stages several productions each year in a state-of-the-art, 650-seat Centennial Hall, and consistently earns Cappie Awards. The School's choral ensembles have sung at The White House, Carnegie Hall, the Academy of Music, Lincoln Center, and on tour throughout Europe. Haverford boasts a robust Lower School music curriculum, including violin in kindergarten and a full band, plus a voice and instrumental conservatory.

Upper School Activities & Clubs

The School's more than 35 clubs include Soft Robotics (2018 and 2017 Harvard University Soft Robotics Design Competition winners), Robotics (2017 World Division Championship – 3rd place), *Index* newspaper (silver medal, Columbia Scholastic Press Association), *Pegasus* literary magazine (gold medal, Columbia Scholastic Press Association), Diplomacy Society, Diversity Alliance, Mock Trial, Poetry Club, and others.

Tuition & Fees

The Haverford School incorporates all anticipated fees in its tuition, which is a direct reflection of recruiting and retaining extraordinary educators. Tuition for the 2018-19 academic year is: pre-k–\$23,000; kindergarten–\$26,500; grades 1-2–\$30,000; grades 3-5–\$31,300; grades 6-8–\$35,200; grades 9-12–\$38,800.
